French-Speaking Seminar: 7-9 September 2011

Sustainable Public Sector Reforms for Times of Crisis

EGPA's decision to initiate in its midst a French-speaking area for debate is intended to facilitate the access of academics, experts, and professionals of the civil service to the most recent streams of thought in Public Management. This track should not, and will not produce hermetic discussions with respect to other languages; indeed EGPA and IIAS' approach to their working languages English and French is that of complement and substitutability. Hence, the choice of Bucharest as host of the first edition: capital of a member State of Francophonie, open to the presence of French and English alongside its own Romance tongue.

This year, the focus will be on the reforms of the public sector in times of crisis.

We expect contributions on the following issues: New Reform Paradigms in Times of Scarcity; Innovation and Cost-Cutting; Administrative Capacity and Reform Implementation; The Impact of "Starting Conditions" on Change Programs; New Leadership for Sustainable Reforms under Strain; Evaluation of Reforms under Public Scrutiny and on Public Marketing and Communication for Times of Crisis.
